SUN strike is claimed to have been the cause of a collision between a car and a Harley Davidson motorbike and its rider.

The accident happened on Saturday evening, just before 6pm.

The driver of the car was pulling out onto Clyde Road after stopping at the giveway sign.

The bike rider suffered minor injuries.

He was scheduled to appear in the Gisborne District Court on Friday.
