Brigade and their families, Lions members, Waimana Volunteer Fire Brigade and Tuhoe iwi members.

The move was prompted by the death of Ripeka Allerby in a house fire in Taneatua in December. The incident inspired the whole community to work together and equip homes with working alarms to move toward the goal of no fire deaths.
