"He quickly paddled back out and he kinda had my inside, but I was going to go no matter what and I was lucky not to kook that wave," added Christie.

Christie finished with the highest heat score of the entire event in the final — 17.96 out of a possible 20 points besting Paerata-Reid's 15.87.
