

patu, or land confiscation, wrongful killings, including executions, years of scorched earth warfare, the failure to implement the Urewera District Native Reserve Act 1896 and the exclusion of Tuhoe from the establishment of Te Urewera National Park"

"Today, was a day to be remembered - a day to celebrate peace and a forwardlooking future," Tuhoe Treaty negotiator and leader Tamati Kruger said.

The ceremony was attended by descendants of premier Richard Seddon, who in 1894 promised Tuhoe dominion

of Auckland, presented Tuhoe by Tuhoe rangatira Kereru, said.

An historic flag that flew at the Tuhoe prophet Rua Kenana's Maungapohatu community was returned by the Auckland War Memorial Museum.


