



2021 TŪHOE MATAAHO CONTRIBUTION

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I need to be on the Tūhoe register to submit an application?

Yes, you must be on the Iwi register to be considered for the Tūhoe Mataaho Contributions. You can visit the Iwi website www.ngaituhoe.iwi.nz to register online or call the Tūhoe - Te Uru Taumatua office on 07 3129 659 to have a form sent to you.

Can I still apply if I am currently disconnected from my Marae-Hapū?

Yes, keeping in mind the allocation of putea is based on contribution to your Hapū-Marae/Whārua/Iwi.

Do I have to be studying at a University to apply?

No. The 'Mataaho Contributions' have been designed to cater for those who are undertaking any form of research that will directly address a current or future challenge for the Iwi.

What do you mean by 'Contributions'?

In this case, a contribution is viewed as a relationship between you and your Iwi; and how you can contribute to the development of your Marae-Hapū, Whārua, Iwi.

What is the maximum allocation?

The maximum allocation per student is \$30,000.

If I'm shortlisted, do I have to attend the wānana in April 2021 in order to be eligible to receive a Mataaho Contribution? Yes

Can I apply for a Tertiary and Adult Education Contribution as well as a Mataaho Contribution?

Yes. Even if you are successful in securing a Tertiary and Adult Education Contribution then you may still be eligible for a Mataaho Contribution.

What is the maximum allocation?

The maximum allocation per student is \$30,000. There are up to five \$30,000 allocations available.

Who do I submit my application form to?

All applications are to be submitted to Tūhoe – Te Uru Taumatua.

What happens if my application is not received before the closing date?

Any incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

How will I know if my request has been received?

You will receive an email confirmation when your request has been received. If you don't receive an email confirmation please contact Tūhoe – Te Uru Taumatua.

What if my application gets lost?

Tūhoe – Te Uru Taumatua will not be responsible for lost or delayed applications caused by incorrect mailing and delivery.

When will decisions be made on successful applications?

Decisions will be made by the 12 March 2021 and applicants will be advised as soon as possible thereafter.

If I am unsuccessful, is there an opportunity to have a review of the decision?

There will be no appeals. The decision of the panel will be final.
